Dear Santa Cruz County Supervisors,

I am writing to urge you to exercise caution and DENY the proposed cell tower installation on Summit Drive.

We understand the need to provide better emergency communication in Bonny Doon, and wish to find a solution that has the greatest expanded coverage and the least amount of impact on the community.

The proposed tower coverage map is quite limited in an area where there is no demonstrated coverage gap. The alternative site at Patrick Road is more removed from dense neighborhoods and would not place this burden directly on families with small children.

Mounting scientific evidence and community concern highlight the need for caution regarding the placement of wireless infrastructure, especially near homes, schools, and playgrounds. The long-term effects of this radiation are not fully understood, and it is simply not right to impose this risk on our most vulnerable residents when viable alternatives exist.

We ask you to prioritize the well-being of your constituents. Please stand with us and deny this cell tower proposal.
