Subject: 2025 Resolution Certifying County Maintained Road Mileage

Meeting Date: June 24, 2025

Formal Title: Adopt resolution certifying County maintained road mileage for 2025, and take related actions

Recommended Actions

1. Adopt resolution certifying the County maintained road mileage for 2025;
2. Direct the Clerk of the Board to return three certified copies of the resolution to the Community Development and Infrastructure Department; and
3. Authorize the Deputy CAO/Director of Community Development and Infrastructure to submit the resolution certifying maintained mileage on behalf of the County to the Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission and to the State of California Department of Transportation.

Executive Summary

In order to receive Highway Users Tax (HUTA) funding, the County must annually adopt a Board resolution certifying current County maintained mileage.

Discussion

As defined in Section 2121 of the California Streets and Highways Code, a Board resolution certifying the total maintained mileage of County Maintained Roads must be submitted each year to the State Controller through the State Department of Transportation. A maintained mileage update resolution for this year is attached for your review and adoption. Upon adoption by the Board, the resolution will be provided to the Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission and to the State of California Department of Transportation.

The previous maintained mileage total was 594.55 per our last report to the State (Board Resolution 189-2024 dated June 25, 2024). Since this last report there has been an overall increase of 0.10 miles due to various additions, deletions, and corrections. This brings the current total maintained mileage to 594.65.

Financial Impact

The Maintained Mileage Certification is a State requirement for local agencies to receive HUTA funds. Approximately \$7.5 million in HUTA funding is budgeted to be received for Fiscal Year 2025-26.
